### General Description

Texts to be discussed are uploaded by **Monday morning** ahead of the session on OLAT (under „Materialien“). The language of discussion is determined by that of the text (*cuius textus, eius lingua*). A debriefing will take place asap after the session, preferably on the basis of a revised version in which changes have been marked.

- The presented texts contain a maximum of **8'000** words. For longer texts, please indicate those parts which are most important.
- Please prepare a handout or a short presentation for your opening talk (10-20').
- Please choose the subject "VK TP Glock" for all e-mails concerning the colloquium.
- Upload your text to OLAT by Monday morning at the latest.
